Fresh out of the box for this season at Méribel's family-friendly Hotel Le Coucou is new alpine restaurant Le Fumoir. Tucked away in the old smoking room, it serves up everything from fondue to tartiflette.

New spa experiences from Tata Harper include mother-daughter and father-son treatments from organic brand Minois, for those travelling with grandparents, or older children.

For younger ones, the Kids and Teens Lab, run by Petit VIP, is a personalised kids 'club open every day for babies, along with their with nannies or parents. For children aged four to 15, there's dog sledding, igloo building, baking and chocolate-making. Teens can enjoy an escape game that takes them through the forest and into Méribel village.
