Le Refuge de la Traye


Above Méribel's satellite village of Les Allues, Refuge de la Traye open in 2019 after much anticipation. The refuge is made up of a cluster of buildings and only 19 guests at a time. Accommodation is swathed in sheepskin throws and high-thread-count sheets, it promises seclusion in highly-luxurious alpine style, along with cutting-edge spa treatments. Getting there entails a 20-minute ride up through the pretty pine forest above Les Allues in the cabin of an all-terrain electric snowcat with panoramic windows.
